September 13 — 15th Sunday after Pentecost Prayer Vigil Weekend Sermon Title: "An Accounting" Scripture: Romans 14:1-12

I'm paraphrasing a comment about this text from Kevin Presley, minister of music at Emmanuel UMC in Memphis, TN: Most of us have unlimited access to one another's opinions via social media, and there's the constant barrage of opinions coming through every news source related to health, politics, race, religion, and so on. Don't you want to "Make your voice heard?" does "Your opinion matter?" Whose opinion will win out - the talking head at Fox or MSNBC? To whom do we listen? ... the loudest voice? ...the most popular?

Paul, in this passage from Romans, is talking to the church about judging and being judged, but ultimately it is about deciding who belongs at the table. How does Paul answer? How do we get everyone to the same table? Doesn't Jesus want us all there?

General Guidelines

Always apply during pandemic

These guidelines have been developed based on the <u>guidance</u> provided by Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson and the Cabinet of the North Georgia Conference.

Social Distancing rules apply.

- Maintain 6ft distance of all people.
- Masks are required inside the building.
- Fellowship Hall capacity will be reduced to 40 people.
- New Fellowship classroom capacity will be reduced to 10 people.

Bathroom Availability - Narthex only

Fellowship Hall entrance, Fellowship Hall Bathrooms, hall bathroom, kitchen, prayer room, library, chapel, upstairs (youth area), downstairs (see exceptions) are all closed.

No food allowed in the building.

Kitchen is not available.

Reopening Stages

In-Person meetings are considered any meetings of 2 or more people that occur on the grounds of Bascomb United Methodist Church, excluding Sunday Worship Services.

Red - If the county is red, the church is effectively closed.

Yellow

When the county moves to yellow, we will begin to allow additional groups to meet in the church. We will not begin right away. For In-Person meetings there must be two (2) consecutive weeks of yellow before we move to these lessened restrictions. In-Person worship may begin immediately upon movement to yellow.

Green

When the county moves to green, we will begin to allow additional groups to meet in the church. We will not begin right away. For In-Person meetings there must be two (2) consecutive weeks of green before we move to these lessened restrictions. In-Person worship may continue or begin immediately upon movement to green.
