We are having in-person worship while still providing online services on Facebook, our website, and FM 95.3.


#### Protocols for Bascomb in-person worship:

- \*Please exit from back to front as the ushers direct please do not gather until you are outside.

#### December 13 — 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent—JOY Sermon Title: "I Believe in ... Music" Scripture: Luke 1:1-4, 26-56 (CEB)

This week we turn to Luke's gospel. Luke wrote his account in two acts: the Gospel biography of Jesus and then the story of the early church. It didn't matter if you were a Jew or Gentile in those days, being a part of this early Christian movement could bring you trouble. So why did the movement become so popular? Well, hear the message again. In both Luke and Isaiah the downcast, the lowly, and the oppressed are the very people God would bless, liberate, and invite into community. Luke's Gospel is a welcome inspiration to these people and that same message of inspiration sustained the Jewish nation of Isaiah's time in exile. We all wonder sometimes where God is in our suffering. It's good news of great JOY to hear the promise...... the angels are singing—God is on the way!


