Ahhh, we are back in Mark's gospel as we come to the last phase of the Christian year – Kingdomtide (green) – the season we are actually living in now. The church is full of "little t" traditions like seasons (and colors) of the Christian year. Some churches only observe Christmas and Easter while other Christians observe every season and every festival of the Saints. Jesus is making an important point here in Mark that we must give proper due.

Martin Luther said: "All festivals should be abolished, and the Lord's Day alone retained....feast days are abused by drinking, gambling, loafing, and all manner of sin, (think about St Patrick's Day) we anger God more on holy days than we do on other days."

When we focus more on the traditions and rituals than our relationships, we fail to get it. Listen to the "red letter" words of Jesus as he reminds us of what really matters to God and God's domain on earth. If traditions and ritual enhance our worship, then great! If they ARE our worship, then our worship is empty.
