May 8 — 4th Sunday of Easter — Mother’s Day
Sermon Title: “...and your entire household”
Scripture: Acts 16:22-34 (16:13-15)

In Acts, Paul deliberately travels into Gentile territory and into trouble. We focus on two instances – his encounter with Lydia and with the Jailer. Acts reports that Lydia’s entire household was saved (do we understand that as converted?). Then Paul delivers the gospel to HIS jailer, and again the text says “you and your entire household” will be saved.

See how these stories connect to our Festival of the Christian home? On the Sunday we celebrate the Christian home and mothers, we should examine how our faith comes to influence everyone that lives in our household. This is exactly what we mean by God’s prevenient grace.
