May 29 — 7th Sunday of Easter Ascension Sunday Sermon Title: "In the Game" Scripture: Luke 24:44-53

How do you best end a story? Well, first make a good beginning. I try to do that with sermon titles. I want you to imagine the content of the sermon because the title draws you into the narrative. So, what do I mean by "In the Game?" In the Game is a gospel concept. (I hope now you are very curious!) It's also important that we be able to identify with the characters in the title. Can you identify with a gospel character? Jesus is (body and all) taken up into heaven. But that is NOT the end of the gospel story, is it? Well, the title gives you a hint – WE are still "In the Game." We call these narratives "gospels" (evangelion in Greek) meaning "good news." But how is Jesus leaving us behind "good news?" Come, let us reason together this Sunday.
