February 12 — Sixth Sunday after the Epiphany
"What Have You Heard?"

Matthew 5:21-37

This Sunday, we go back to our sermons from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. We will still be in Matthew the fifth chapter, and we look at where Jesus talked how Torah says that murder was forbidden and was subject to judgment. Then we're told that Jesus also says that the anger of anyone was subject to judgment too.

Something sounds off there. Was Jesus saying that murder and anger were the same thing with both being subject to judgment? Was Jesus using "double talk" in order to show he was going to interpret and change the Jewish laws and Torah itself? Or maybe, just maybe, Jesus was trying to tell those listening how to be careful with one's anger.
