February 19 — Transfiguration Sunday "Everybody's Afraid!" Matthew 17:1-9

One of my first memories of going to Mass (raised Catholic) was going up to the priest and having him put something on my forehead during an Ash Wednesday service. I wasn't sure what the grayish-black cross on my forehead meant back then but over the years, I have come to embrace the meaning found in its service through the United Methodist Church.

My UMC Book of Worship says that the use of ashes have been used for centuries in both the Christian and Jewish faiths. Using the ashes during a worship setting can be done as a part of our call to repentance and reconciliation to God during these future 40 days of Lent.
