March 5 — Second Sunday of Lent "God's Unique Gift" John 3:1-17

What is the greatest gift you ever received? There is a part of me which would say that the greatest gift I have ever received is mine and Brenda's granddaughter, Rowan Grace. She is such a joy for both of us. We love spending every minute that we can with her.

But there is also another part of me that would say that the greatest gift I have ever received is God's gift of His Son and my Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
