September 3—Holy Communion "I Will Be There" Exodus 3: 1-20

This past week Brenda and I have been out of town in Indiana for the funeral of my last remaining uncle on my Mom's side of the family. As our families got together, we began to share some of the stories of how my Mom and her five brothers grew up in a small town in Indiana located on the Ohio River. The six of them and their parents truly grew up from very humble beginnings. But when it was all said and done, each of the six siblings truly made something out of their lives.

This coming Sunday, we are going to hear about the humble beginnings of another person. He was born to a Hebrew slave woman. She was supposed to throw him into the Nile River to kill him because Pharoah believed that the Hebrews were beginning to outnumber their Egyptians. But the Hebrew slave woman refused to do that to her son so she created a plan that could possibly save her son.

She created a basket that could float on water and sent the basket to a nearby pool on the Nile where Pharoah's daughter was bathing with her servants. One of those servants spotted the basket with the baby in it and took it to Pharoah's daughter who decided to take the child with her to raise as her own.

So, the Hebrew child went from a life of being a slave to becoming a child of Pharoah's daughter. And that was just the beginning of the story I will share with you this Sunday. A story of a man with humble beginnings who ends up killing an Egyptian which then puts his own life in jeopardy. What else could happen? So much more!
